COMMUNICATION GUIDELINES

These guidelines should be followed for ALL phone calls, emails, letters, blogs and packages.

- 1. Do not refer to our work as "missionary" work, which could compromise our position. Simply "work" works.
- Do not criticize the host country's government or policies.
- 3. Do not mention missions, evangelism, witnessing, giving out Bibles, the host country's church, support raising, etc.
- 4. Do not send missionary prayer letters, tracts, church bulletins, missions magazines, Bibles, etc.
- 5. Do not send correspondence on church stationery, or packaging with church labels.
- 6. Limit your use of Christian language and avioid mention of Christian organizations.
- 7. Do not publish and information about us on your Facebook, web account, Twitter, etc.
- 8. Do not send bulk email.
- Only give out our email or mailing address to people who have a copy of these guidelines. It is also advisable to have permission from us before you give out our email address to anyone.
- 10. If you do write to us, remember that first class mail, in most cases, can take weeks to reach us, so be sure to send mail early!
